## 2023 Medicaid Guidelines for Medicare Savings Program and Medicaid

If you live in New York and have limited income, you may be newly eligible to receive assistance with your health care costs through Medicare Savings Program or Medicaid.

**Medicare Savings Program** helps pay Part B premiums. If you qualify for this program, you will automatically get extra help, the federal program that helps pay your Medicare prescription drug (Part D) costs.

**Medicaid** provides healthcare for certain people with limited income and assets. For services covered by Medicare and Medicaid, Medicare pays first. Medicaid may pay cost sharing, including co-insurance and copayments. It may also cover services Medicare does not cover, like vision or dental.

If you are currently enrolled in either program, you may receive more comprehensive benefits in 2023.

## **2023 New York Gross Monthly Income Limits**

QI - Helps pay your Part B premium for you (\$164.90)

IndividualCoupleAssets\$2,260\$3,057No Limit

**QMB** -Qualified Medicare Beneficiary Program helps pay Part A, B, deductibles, copays, and co-insurance. Pays 20% of what Medicare does not pick up and Part B premium.

IndividualCoupleAssets\$1,679\$2,288No Limit

If you meet the income limits above, the Medicare Rights Center call 800-333-4114 to apply. If your income is close, it is often worth applying.
